#### 1 Confidential minutes

The confidential minutes of the Board meeting held on 25 May 2010 were approved and signed for the record.

#### 2 Meeting Review

Members agreed to ask Hugh Sumner if the Olympic Delivery Authority (ODA) would make a financial contribution to London TravelWatch to cover extra demands placed upon it by the Olympics and Paralympics in 2012. They also discussed whether London inhabitants would leave the city during the Olympics. At the Sydney Olympiad, the city had effectively closed down.

Members felt that the failure of the Mayor's Transport Strategy (MTS) to address access to healthcare facilities should be highlighted.

It was agreed that ticket travel for the Olympics should be discussed at the Fares and Ticketing Committee.

Members discussed risks posed to the organisation. In particular the acoustics of the room and the earlier than planned start of Richard Browning's presentation were highlighted.
